By integrating wellness and recovery into a strengths-based program, TAY provides young adults aged 16 to 25 in Marin with mental health and supportive services including personal case management, 24-hour crisis management, medication oversight, peer mentoring, housing, education, and employment. Since it began in 2007, TAY Program has provided 28 young adults with “full services” to help them find their way through the difficult transition of adolescence to young adulthood. Another 163 youth have taken advantage of one of more TAY offerings in Marin.
